# **Blithe Spirit and Noel Coward**

Noel Coward (1899-1973) was a leading figure in the theatre for most of his lifetime. He appeared in numerous plays, musicals, revues and films throughout his life and in older age took on the iconic role of Mr Bridger in *The Italian Job* alongside Michael Caine. Despite having little formal schooling, he became one of the most prolific playwrights of his day completing fifty plays over a very long career. The short play *Still Life* was adapted by him into the famous film *Brief Encounter*, directed by David Lean and starring Trevor Howard and Celia Johnson.

His partnership with Gertrude Lawrence was legendary, they appeared on stage together as lovers in countless plays, musicals and revues. But they were not a couple. Noel was gay, a fact not publicly acknowledged until after his death, due to the prevailing attitudes of the time. He was knighted in 1970 and spent his final years in the Caribbean.

Blithe Spirit was written in 1941, right in the middle of the War. But the play seeks to escape from the developing turmoil by laughing at the story of a fake medium and the haunting of Charles Condomine (originally played by Noel himself) by two past wives. It provided light relief at a difficult time, as it still does today. Our version is set in 1935, in a world defiantly jolly and excessively bright, despite the storm clouds on the horizon. We do hope you will appreciate the parallels with 2023.


